MAKING A DIFFERENCE

RURAL SCHOLARS TRACK

Mason C. Liles, DDS, a 2021 dental graduate, was a recipient of a LSUSD Rural Scholars Track (RST) Scholarship in his third and fourth year of dental school. The scholarships, funded with private donations, help to address the maldistribution of dentists in the state by encouraging students to practice in Louisiana Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA), which are primarily rural. In 2019, 59 of the 64 parishes in Louisiana were designated as such. For every year that a student receives a waiver of their base tuition, they are required by contract to practice in a HPSA area for at least one year. Most dentists and specialists in the field are concentrated in urban areas of the state for economic reasons.

Dr. Liles is now practicing full-time and splitting his services between two small towns in Richland Parish —Mangham (population 672) and Rayville (population 3514). Both are low-income population Dental HPSAs. He also teamed up with a local therapist who works with autistic children to help them feel comfortable enough for a dental diagnosis and subsequent treatment by a dental specialist. His patient base is split equally among Medicaid, private insurance and private pay.

Dr. Liles chose to work in a rural area because he was raised in Winnsboro, a small town with a population of less than 5,000. As a resident, he realized there was a need for more healthcare providers, especially dentists.

"The healthcare community in the rural area is great to work with because you get to know all the physicians, practitioners, therapists, and other providers. It makes it easier to provide a treatment plan specific for a patient's overall needs through collaboration with other providers," he said. "Patients also become like family because you see them around town, like at the grocery store or a baseball game."
